Is your faith securely rooted and grounded in the Word of God? Will you be able to stand firm when your faith is tested? Paul encourages believers in 1 Corinthians 15:58 to stand firm and let nothing move them. The goal of AreaOne SummerCON 2015 is to give students the biblical tools they need to do just that - STAND. Keynote Speaker

Alan Shlemon

Alan is turning the tide on Christian training. He knows many believers aren't equipped to persuasively share their convictions with our culture. It's difficult.

People often view Christians as anti-science, anti-choice, judgmental, homophobic, and intolerant. They see the Church as backward-thinking. Though they're largely mistaken, that perception repels people from the truth of Jesus. Worse, many Christians struggle to respond in a persuasive, yet gracious manner. They don't feel confident to engage people in conversation about their convictions. That's why Alan has dedicated his life to training Christians to thoughtfully articulate their faith and values. He realizes that when people are properly equipped, they're more confident about talking with others. Because they become more skilled in maneuvering in conversation, they're more effective at sharing their faith.

Alan's work represents the best in Christian thinking and the art of conversational persuasion on challenging issues of our day. In fact, he has distinguished himself in training Christians about the most controversial issues of our time like evolution, abortion, relativism, homosexuality, euthanasia, cloning, and Islam. His broad experience allows him to bring clear thinking to almost any current topic. Alan's training incorporates three components. First, he equips people with the knowledge to form a foundation of belief. Second, he teaches them to communicate their knowledge in ways that are persuasive and clear. Finally, he shows them how to make the manner of their approach warm, friendly, and gracious. What makes his training unique is his ability to make complex issues accessible to anyone--adult or youth audiences. Alan graduated from California State University, Long Beach and holds a Master of Arts in Christian Apologetics from Biola University. He has been a guest on both TV and radio, and has spoken to thousands of adults and students across the country at churches, conferences, and college campuses. He lives in San Diego, California with his wife, Jennifer, and two children.

Housing and Location

Windermere Conference Center in Roach, Missouri is one of the top rated camps in the nation. With 1,800 acres right on the beautiful Lake of the Ozarks, your students will love the top notch facilities and incredible surroundings. The main auditorium and housing AreaOne uses is recent construction. The housing is hotel-like, each with four twin-sized bunk beds, key cards, private bathrooms and air conditioning. The facility is situated in a secluded cove on Lake of the Ozarks, so feel free to bring your boat. If you do, Windermere has a marina that you can leave your boat in each night. In the lake is one of the nation's largest inflatable water parks for your students to jump on and enjoy. Windermere's top notch facilities and AreaOne are a dynamic combination.

HOUSING: All housing is hotel style with 8 people per room in the Wilderness Creek area of the campus (unless overflow areas are needed). Linens, towels and toiletries are not provided. Please have at least one adult per room.

Registering for AreaOne conferences is a simple three step process:

1. Register online, call, mail or fax in the "Group Registration Form" with an estimate of your group size.
2. Pay deposits of \$50 per attendee. The date of your conference deposit postmark determines your price bracket. Checks, PayPal, and credit cards are accepted for deposits. A signed Group Registration form must accompany deposits.
3. Balance is due by May 1, 2015. Checks are preferable. PayPal and credit cards accepted with a 3% processing fee.

All registrations after May 1, 2015 require immediate payment. A \$10 late fee per attendee will be applied to all outstanding balances after May 1st. Call registration support at 888.GOAREA1 ext 2 and we'll work with you. Bring each attendee's filled out "Individual Registration/ Health-Release" form to the conference. Registration request will be confirmed by phone or email within 48 hours. Please call us at 888.GOAREA1 ex 2 if you do not get a response confirming that we received your registration.
